Hello to all in this Autumn season,

I arrived here in Oyen, AB, earlier than some had expected. I officially came to Oyen on August 21, 2022, after the summer camp season ended. I had the honour of spending all summer at Camp Shagabec, located in the beautiful Cypress hills on the Saskatchewan side of the Interprovincial park. This is an incredible United church camp est. in 1938 where everyone has always been welcomed and accepted for who they are, as they are. I may be biased, but this Camp has been a part of my life for the past eight years. The people gave me a place to call home, to belong, to be accepted, welcomed and uplifted for who I am, as I am. After getting kicked out of the camp next door that I attended for ever a decade and worked at for the last three years of that time. All for who I am, for standing by God, with God and for God's truth and love. So with all this being said, my summers are dedicated to giving back to Camp Shagabec for what the people and camp have given me over these past eight years. In my darkest and most challenging moments, they were there. I could never repay what Camp Shagabec has given me, but giving back through my time, commitment, energy, and summers is a small step that allows other kids to receive the same love, welcome and acceptance I have. I and all of us at Camp Shagabec do what needs to be done, and here for the children, that makes it all possible.

So, after an incredible summer in the place I love the most, I rode on a high when I came to Oyen. This feeling has carried on through my time as the Minister for the Big Country United Churches. God's call led me to these unique communities of faith and

the four communities they are situated in. The moment I got to these communities, I felt a sense of peace, of feeling this as the right place to be but, most importantly, the place I am called to be. That, for me, is an essential part of God's call to be here, the discernment behind hearing and answering that call.

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I am incredibly grateful for the opportunity and faith these churches and communities have in me, to be their minister and to be involved in the communities as a fellow neighbour. These incredible, beautiful and unique people of these churches have accepted and uplifted me, allowing my crazy beautiful ADHD brain to spew out all kinds of new and exciting ideas to help move us in a new direction. A very bright future is ahead of us. I take no credit for this. It Is because of the willingness, eagerness, love, passion, acceptance and upliftment of the communities of the Big Country United Churches. As a minister, a new minister and for a first charge or, in my case, a first 4. Charge is so refreshing. It is so encouraging. You all do not want to give up; you have the love, passion and drive to fight.....to thrive, not just survive. I can promise I will be here and help in every way I can to see us become sustainable and hopefully grow for as long as I can. I had a massive reality check today. My heart, love, call and commitment are here with all of you. I have huge goals, plans and hopes for the Big Country United Churches.

However, the financial reality of our situation sunk in recently. As the Big Country United Churches, we are suffering financially as of right now. We can not support a full-time minister. We also face the reality of this financial situation in all aspects of our ministry, including our building. Churches do not just exist. Churches cost a lot to stay open. Our ministry has been a statement in Our community since the founding of Oyen. Our mission is to give back and support those in our communities who are in need. We run on the weekly donations and fundraising we do throughout the year. As the incredibly generous members of our church have aged and been called to their heavenly homes, we no longer have the numbers to be sustainable. This means the ministry and outreach we provide for the community, through the ministerial, food bank, donating and supporting community events, support for families, funerals, weddings, and activities done within our building, will no longer be possible if this continues. This means these

services provided, the support for the community and those who need it will not be able to continue. This means things such as the food bank, back-to-school supplies, financial support for those suffering for many reasons, those who need help to eat every month etc., will be gone. Our churches are suffering. If we, the churches, are forced to close, the community will end up suffering. This also means there will be a time I physically can not continue. However, the future is bright, and we have time and the ability to change that. My hope and prayer, along with my commitment, love and call from God, will not change for all of you and our communities. This is where God has called me too.

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I strongly believe in Matthew 18:19–20 (NRSV): "19 Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. 20 For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am among them."
